Morden Trust (Matching Grant) – When a Hillside student attends Indiana Wesleyan University, a significant scholarship opportunity is available, which can then be matched by the University. The amount is determined by how many students are granted the scholarship. A usual amount is approximately \$1,500 annually, which then becomes \$3,000 by the match. Applications are available at www.lifeonthehillside.com/form.

Mark Porter Grant – In memory of Mark Porter who tragically died before college, Hillside created a fund in his name. \$1,000 is granted to a high school senior preparing for college and \$500 for any year after that. Students can only receive this grant twice. This grant is available for students to go to any university, Wesleyan or non-Wesleyan. Applications are available at www.lifeonthehillside.com/form.

Campus Challenge – The Wesleyan denomination has a talent competition each summer in two locations; Southern Wesleyan University and Indiana Wesleyan University. Middle and high school students can compete in singing, playing instruments, oration, art, photography, dance, drama, videography, and other categories. Those who rank well are given scholarship funds, which may be applied to any Wesleyan University. Scholarships may accumulate from 6th grade through 12th. This year's competition at IWU is July 25.
